



Appointment of Directors to Fill Casual Vacancies

The National Rifle Association of Australia (NRAA) is the National Sporting Organisation (NSO) responsible for leading the sport of long-range target shooting in Australia. It is a not-for-profit organisation, a member of Shooting Australia and the International Confederation of Fullbore Rifle Associations (ICFRA).

Australian Teams recently won the 2024 World Championships in Target Rifle in the Open and Veterans (Over 60) categories. Australian shooters also won four of the five individual World Championships in the Target Rifle categories contested. In 2023, the Australian F-Open team won the bronze medal in the F-Class World Championships.

The NRAA is currently seeking appropriately skilled and experienced persons to fill two casual Director vacancies on the NRAA Board. These positions are voluntary roles, but approved expenses associated with carrying out the duties are reimbursable.

The positions will be appointed until the 2024 AGM, which will be held in November 2024. The appointed Directors will be encouraged to stand for election at the AGM for a term of two or three years. Candidates who are either NRAA members (through its State and Territory Organisations) or independent persons, are encouraged to apply.

The NRAA is seeking to diversify its culture and expand the skills on its Board, with applications from women encouraged. The NRAA's Directors are allocated a portfolio and the focus of one of the casual appointments will be training, coaching programs and pathway development so appropriate skills and experience (from other sports or corporate organisations) will be highly valued.

The other vacancy is open to a person with a legal and/or financial background, and may suit an independent person looking to contribute their skills and experience for the betterment of the organisation.

NRAA has a Board of Directors (currently up to five maximum), two staff members and a range of Committees which combine to administer and implement the key objectives of the Organisation. Across its nine State and Territory member organisations, there are over 6,500 individual members.

Nominations are sought from interested persons with the suitable skills and experience outlined and seeking to be part of a progressive Board developing the sport of competitive long-range target shooting.
