Appointment of Director to Fill Casual Vacancy

The National Rifle Association of Australia (NRAA) is the National Sporting Organisation (NSO) responsible for leading the sport of long-range target shooting in Australia. It is a not-for-profit organisation, a member of Shooting Australia (responsible for Olympic Games selections) and the International Confederation of Fullbore Rifle Associations (ICFRA).

Australian Teams recently won the 2024 World Championships in Target Rifle in the Open and Veterans (Over 60) categories. Australian shooters also won four of the five individual World Championships in the Target Rifle categories contested. In 2023, the Australian F-Open team won the bronze medal in the F-Class World Championships.

Australian Teams will be competing internationally at the 2026 F Class World Championships in England after finishing in 3rd position in 2023. The NRAA will also be hosting ICFRA international Teams matches as part of the October 2026 National Rife Championships in Brisbane.

The NRAA is currently seeking a skilled and experienced person to fill a casual Director vacancy on the NRAA Board. Director positions are voluntary roles, but approved expenses associated with carrying out the duties are reimbursable.

The position will be appointed until the 2025 AGM, which will be held in November 2025. The appointed Director will be encouraged to stand for election at the AGM for a term of two or three years. Candidates who are either NRAA members (through its State and Territory Organisations) or independent persons, are encouraged to apply.

With the appointment of this Director position, the NRAA is seeking to expand the skills on its Board to include a marketing, promotions and sponsorship background. Experience in a corporate background, not-for-profit or another sport would be highly valued.

NRAA has a Board of Directors (currently up to five maximum), three staff members and a part-time accountant. A range of Committees operate to administer and implement the key objectives of the Organisation. Across its nine State and Territory member organisations, there are over 6,500 individual members.

Nominations are sought from interested persons with the suitable skills and experience outlined and seeking to be part of a progressive Board developing the sport of competitive long-range target shooting.
